

Code of Practice for Volunteers

Volunteers are the lifeblood of our work to promote the Leeds-Settle-Carlisle Line. The roles we perform vary considerably but nonetheless we all have a responsibility to uphold high standards. We are committed to protect and enhance the good reputation of the railway family, FoSCL our partners and stakeholders. Our mutual expectations are:

Volunteers will:

- promote the Leeds-Settle-Carlisle line in any contact with the public
- represent FoSCL positively and actively promote the organisation and its work
- maintain helpful and appropriate relationships with volunteers and partner bodies
- abide by agreed policies relating to health and safety, safeguarding and equality
- work collaboratively with colleagues (including participation in rotas as required)
- be responsible and accountable in the way the role is performed
- be fair and treat everyone with respect, courtesy and sensitivity
- > challenge inappropriate behaviour, poor practice or poor service to the public
- > share information within the team and organisation (unless restricted or confidential)
- > communicate openly, professionally and respectfully
- do their best to enjoy volunteering, be an advocate and commend it to others

FoSCL will:

- seek to provide a suitable environment in which volunteers work
- provide a written activity description for each distinctive volunteering role
- offer support and training for volunteers where appropriate
- > promote opportunities to share good practice and learn from others
- create a feedback loop for complaints, suggestions and improvements
- provide opportunities to meet other volunteers including occasional social events
- promote volunteering tso it can be satisfying, rewarding and fun

The Code applies to Office Holders, Committee members, Team Leaders and Volunteers

Breaches of the Code

- 1. In the first instance a mutually acceptable way to move forward will be discussed with the parties involved. In most cases it is expected this will be sufficient to resolve the issue.
- 2. If the code is breached again by the same person it will be investigated and, if proven, may lead to restrictions or withdrawal of the volunteers role.
- 3. A right of appeal is available. This will be heard by 1 Committee Member, 1 Team Leader and 1 Volunteer none of whom have any involvement or direct interest in the case.
