Our free guided walks date back to the earliest FoSCL campaign aimed at preventing closure of the Settle-Carlisle train line. Visit our website at foscl.org.uk to find out more about our history. It is a pleasure to still offer free guided walks all these years later and we are proud of the contribution FoSCL made to safeguard England's most scenic railway for everyone to enjoy.

All of our walks start and/or finish from stations on the Leeds-Settle-Carlisle Line and do not require a car. There is no need to book in advance so just buy your train ticket and meet us at the station! See our website for train ticket tips.

Everyone is welcome to come along but if you are new to hiking or have had a long break from it, please start with the easier walks. The landscape in this part of the country means that a route will almost always involve a hill or two, have stiles to climb over and possibly tricky terrain. It is best to build up to longer, more strenuous walks so that you enjoy them more and feel comfortable with the pace.

We look forward to you joining us to explore the beautiful countryside and experience a wonderful trip on the fantastic Leeds-Settle-Carlisle line.

Saltaire Circular: a World Heritage Site

Walk from Saltaire passing Five Rise Locks, an incredible feat of engineering. Enjoy long distance views across the Aire Valley.

Horton to Settle via Norber Erratics

One of our most popular walks. Stroll amongst huge boulders deposited by glaciers and marvel at nature.

We climb up the nose of Pen-y-Ghent on the first of our Peaks then use the alternative route down Plover Hill - that's the tweak!



Long Preston to Settle

Short, leisurely walk for a Sunday with lovely views and plenty of time to wander around Settle when we finish.



Grade: Walker Distance: 5mi / 8km

Six Peaks Trail Day 3. Garsdale to Ribblehead via Great Knoutberry and Arten Gill. 11.5mi

Kirkby Stephen circular via Smardale Nature Reserve and Kirkby Stephen town. 12mi

Settle circular via Smearsett Scar and Oxenber Woods (wild flowers) and Feizor. 12mi

Settle circular via the Hoffman Kiln, Archimedes Screw and along the River Ribble. 6mi

Appleby circular climbing High Cup Nick and High Cup Nick Gill. 14mi

This lower level walk includes potholes and a hidden valley ending at the famous Ribblehead Viaduct.

Discover historic Kirkoswald including its community run shop and take away alongside a stroll through beech woods.

A dramatic walk via Studrigg Scar with limestone pavements and views of Crummackdale.

Gargrave Circular

A lovely walk from Gargrave with a taster of the mighty Pennine Way and glorious views of the Yorkshire countryside.

Whelpstone Crag from Settle

A Settle Circular walk via Whelpstone Crag, the highest point of Gisburn Forest in the Forest of Bowland.

Grade: Hiker Distance: 12mi / 19.3km

Hellifield to Skipton

An exhilarating walk through the moors and villages to the West of Skipton, the Gateway to the Dales.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

- Don't forget this is Yorkshire and Cumbria. No matter the walk, there will nearly always be stiles to clamber over, streams to cross, rough ground, hills to climb, slippery bits and boggy bits...
- It rains. A lot. We get snow in April. Suitable clothing and footwear for the walk is essential. When the sun comes out, don't forget your sunscreen!
- Bring food and water for a day's walk plus anything else you feel you may need. Remember, you are responsible for your own comfort and safety on any walks.
- Due to the number of livestock in the area we do not allow dogs on any of our walks except for registered assistance dogs. Apologies to our four-legged friends.
- Young people under 18 and vulnerable adults must be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult/carer.
- Walks may be subject to cancellation or alteration without notice.
 Wherever possible, updates will be placed on the FoSCL website.
- Timings are given in good faith but cannot be guaranteed. Changes or cancellations to these walks will be notified on the FoSCL website.
- Most walks are timed to use the 09:19 train from Leeds to Carlisle (08:59 on Sundays). However, some walks use the earlier or later trains so please check train times and stations carefully when reading the walk details.
- Return trains are shown for guidance only these may be varied on the day by the Walk Leaders due to prevailing or forecast weather conditions or the pace of the group. You are strongly advised NOT to purchase Advance Tickets for specific timed trains.
- Please check the current timetable northernrailway.co.uk to see what time the relevant train arrives at the start station. Details of connecting trains are available online from National Rail Enquiries via nationalrail.co.uk
