

Welcome to Friends of the Settle-Carlisle Line free guided walks

Our free guided walks date back to the earliest FoSCL campaign aimed at preventing closure of the Settle-Carlisle train line. Visit our website at foscl.org.uk to find out more about our history and how we continue to support England's most scenic railway.

All of our walks start and/or finish from train stations, usually on the Leeds-Settle-Carlisle Line, and do not require a car. There is no need to book in advance so just buy your train ticket and meet us at the station! See our website for train ticket tips.

Everyone is welcome but if you are new to hiking or have had a long break from it, please start with the easier walks. The landscape in this part of the country means that a route will usually involve a hill or two, have stiles to climb over and possibly tricky terrain. It is best to build up to longer, more strenuous walks so that you enjoy them and feel comfortable with the pace.

Ribble Valley Line: Ramsgreave to Whalley

Travel on the new Yorkshire Dales Explorer train service to the beautiful Ribble Valley. Important: see our website for train info.

Ivelet Moor in Glorious Swaledale

Alight Ribblehead for Northern DalesBus to Gunnerside (return fare payable) for a fabulous walk to Ivelet Moor.

Grade: Explorer! Distance: 9mi / 14.5km

Semerwater and Bainbridge from Hawes

We take the Northern DalesBus to Hawes (return fare payable) and walk to Semerwater, a place of myths and legends!

A Walk in Bronte Country from Haworth

A trip through history to where the Bronte Sisters lived and walked. Bus from Keighley to Haworth: see our website for details.

In Search of Ursus and Salmo

On this riverside walk we are unlikely to see Ursus Arctos but we might see his favourite food Salmo Salar leaping Stainforth Force!

Hellifield to Skipton

A walk from Hellifield through pretty villages and over rolling hills, following the River Aire and Leeds Liverpool canal to Skipton.

Saturday 30th

Hike around Horton-in-Ribblesdale

A shorter, slower paced scenic walk in the environs of Horton-in-Ribblesdale with plenty of time to admire the views.

MARCH

Saturday 8th

Long Preston to Settle via the Ribble Way

Follow the Ribble Way through gently rolling countryside from Long Preston to the picturesque market town of Settle.

Saturday 15th

St Ives Estate and Altar Crag

A walk from Keighley to Bingley passing through the historic St lves estate, the former home of the Ferrands family.

Arrive: 09:45 **Keighley** Depart: 16:26 **Bingley** Grade: **Hiker** Distance: **10mi** / **16.1km**

Saturday 22nd

Ribble Valley Line: Langho to Clitheroe

Another opportunity to use the Yorkshire Dales Explorer train to visit the Ribble Valley. **Important: see our website for train info.**

Saturday 29th

Moorland Walk and the Doubler Stones

A beautiful moorland walk from Bingley to Keighley via the impressive gritstone rocks of the Doubler Stones.

Arrive: 09:38 Bingley Depart: 17:09 Keighley Grade: Explorer! Distance: 12mi / 19.3km



IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

- Don't forget this is The North. No matter the walk, there will nearly always be stiles to clamber over, streams to cross, rough ground, hills to climb, slippery bits and boggy bits...
- It rains. A lot. We get snow in April. Suitable clothing and footwear for the walk is essential. If it's sunny, don't forget your sunscreen!
- Bring food and water for a day's walk plus anything else you feel you may need. Remember, you are responsible for your own comfort and safety on any walks.
- Due to the number of livestock in the area we do not allow dogs on any of our walks except for registered assistance dogs. Apologies to our four-legged friends.
- Young people under 18 and vulnerable adults must be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult/carer.
- Walks may be subject to cancellation or alteration. Check our website and/or Facebook page for any changes before travelling.
- Most walks are timed to use the 09:19 train from Leeds to Carlisle (09:09 on Sundays). However, some walks use the earlier or later trains so please check train times and stations carefully when reading the walk details.
- Return trains are shown for guidance only these may be varied on the day by the Walk Leaders due to prevailing or forecast weather conditions or the pace of the group. You are strongly advised NOT to purchase Advance Tickets for specific timed trains.
- Please check the current timetable northernrailway.co.uk to see what time the relevant train arrives at the start station. Details of connecting trains are available online from National Rail Enquiries via nationalrail.co.uk
